Empire State College offers a unique opportunity to earn a respected SUNY degree conveniently and efficiently. It was created 40 years ago to be the SUNY college *for adults*, so it operates differently from all the other SUNY colleges and from traditional colleges in general.

- Personal Attention: Every Empire State College student gets a professor as your personal mentor from the day you enroll to the day you graduate. Your mentor guides you as you design your own individualized degree program.
- Convenient Ways to Study: You choose not only which courses to take, but how to take each one, depending on your schedule (work and personal responsibilities) and how you prefer to learn:
 - Study Group--- small (8-12 students), meets once each week for two hours at an Empire State College site in Manhattan, Brooklyn, Staten Island, Nassau, Suffolk, Westchester (and all across New York State).
 - Independent Study--- one-to-one arrangement between student and teacher, working through a flexible combination of home study, email, phone, and in-person meetings. You can request independent study on *any* topic that interests you, even if it's never been offered before.
 - Online Course--- combines group interaction (through email and chat) with space and time flexibility (work anywhere that has Internet, whenever you choose).

 For an associate degree (64 credits), you can get up to 40 credits for prior learning. For a bachelor's degree (128 credits), you can get up to 96 credits for prior learning.

BASIC FACTS about SUNY Empire State College

- Eligibility: No prior college required, no SAT or ACT. New York State requires proof of high school completion (diploma, GED, final transcript) and proof of childhood immunizations.
- Application: You can apply online (and learn more about Empire State College) at the college's website, <u>www.esc.edu</u>. Hard copy applications are also available.
- Financial Aid Information: The Empire State College website, <u>www.esc.edu</u>, provides information, forms, and answers to questions by email or phone.
- Majors: Empire State College offers most majors, including all areas of Business, Computer Science, Community and Human Services, and the traditional college subjects (History, English, Psychology, etc.) as well as Interdisciplinary majors that students design themselves.
- Tuition: at \$207/credit, SUNY tuition is a bargain. (And if you live outside of New York State, the tuition is the same if you study online.) And a one-time fee gets up to 96 credits for prior learning.
